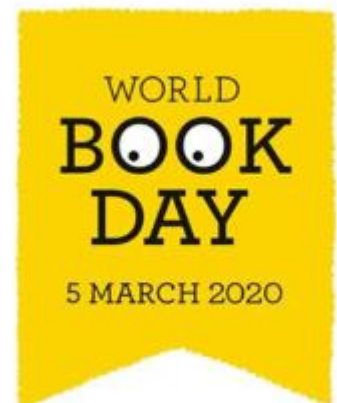




Acorn finding out about the changing states of chocolate...yum!
