This week in class...

Pre-school: Preschool has been very interested in who is the tallest this week and several of the children have built tall towers to measure themselves against. We have all measured ourselves and made a chart to show who is the tallest/smallest. We have also been doing lots of puzzles and Lucas and his friends went on to experiment with the acrylic puzzle to see what the room would look in different colours. Please note, as our wasp problem appears to have disappeared, we will resume using the side gate for pre-school rather than the large metal gate.

Acorn: Acorn Class have been celebrating friendship this week and thinking about how a good friend behaves. We have also been learning how to join fabrics.
