### **This week in class...**

**Little Brown Hare:** Christmas has arrived at Little Brown Hare with many craft activities that involve plenty of glue and sparkles along with decorating the pine tree. This week the children have also been engaging in large scale construction, challenging themselves physically and mentally as they take risks climbing, jumping and balancing. At LBH we follow the children's interests and enhance their play, some of the children have been pirates which has also included lots of mark making opportunities.

**Blackbirds:** Blackbirds Class have continued painting and writing about their feelings and this week. As well as some very thoughtful poems, they have been painting pictures in the style of Mark Rothko. The pictures in the photo are of 'having a cold' and 'feeling sleepy and calm'. In maths, we have all been very busy making and ordering numbers and starting to think about place value. The children have been excited to celebrate advent as we look forward to Christmas. Father Christmas has very kindly lent us some books, with one new story to unwrap each day of advent. We also have a kindness calendar and are thinking about a new kind thing each day.

**Wagtails:** We've been finding out all about Chinese dragons this week. We discovered that a Chinese dragon in most cases was actually made up of over 6 animals parts! We were very surprised to see that one of the animal parts was actually the eyes of a rabbit! We used this knowledge to then design our own dragons before then making them using the origami. The children then had to come up with a legend/myth for their dragon. The children really applied their prior knowledge to this section of the task and included many aspects of myths we have looked at over the course of this term. This helped them to create some very detailed and entertaining back stories.

**Skylarks:** Skylarks can at last announce the grand opening of their outdoor sculpture trail! It was formally opened courtesy of our esteemed Headteacher, Mrs Watts. The ribbon was cut, cakes were served (decorated by Skylarks) and the children showed Mrs Watts round the trail. She was very impressed with the art work and ideas they had come up with! Wagtails were invited and arrived later to find the sculptures using a leaflet produced by the Skylarks. Wagtails were excited to solve the puzzle/riddle at each station with prizes for the children who solved the challenge.

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
