This week in class...

Pre-school: This week preschool has been playing 'going to the cinema' and a couple of boys built their own. It became quite a problem when some of the audience kept talking on their mobile phones and refused to turn them off! We have also practiced using prepositions this week and the children were able to tell me if teddy was on, in or behind the table etc. A note will go home next week inviting the children going up to big school to come along to their graduation party.

Acorn: Acorn Class have been learning about the geography of the UK and the world this week. The children have learnt about the four countries of the UK as well as the continents and oceans in the world. On the same topic, we have painted the watercolour pictures of a shipwreck based on Turner's paintings. Separate parts of the picture were painted then combined in a collage to create the final piece. Finally, the children have been thinking about being shipwrecked on an island. They have made poems of ten things that a shipwrecked sailor might have in his pocket. Next week we have an exciting visit to a London museum in the way of an interactive session with the Victoria and Albert museum. The education team at the V&A will take the children on an adventure to four countries, looking at the culture and artwork there through their artefacts.

Oak: Oak class have been busy this week getting things ready for our Grand Tour of Europe. In maths YR5/6 have been learning about volume and capacity and we have been building structures and calculating their volume.
