This week in class...

Pre-school: This week in preschool we have seen lots of small world play. The children have played with the garage and made car runs from the large wooden blocks. Our new parking area has also been popular as has the petrol pump. We have been adding vocabulary captions to help children extend their sentences. We are still busy getting to know each other and the older, more experienced, children have been helping settle the new ones.

Acorn: Acorn class have been learning about what happened during the Great Fire of London through the story of Sammy the Street Dog. The older children have been consolidating their writing skills after the break and the younger children have been writing their names. During circle time, the class have been thinking about what makes them special.
