Pre-school: We have been feeling autumnal this week in preschool. We have collected and explored leaves, discussed the changing colours of the trees and our loose parts play has had an autumn feel too. Our first Stay and Play session was a success and we met several new families. Can we say a big thank you too to the unknown donor of our new lawnmower - the children love it.

Acorn: Acorn Class have continued to learn about habitats this week. We had an exciting visit from Banham Zoo which complimented the classroom experience. Children had the chance to visit creatures from a Bearded Dragon to a Milk Snake and a Giant Millipede. They had an opportunity to think about the creatures' habitat and how it may have adapted to live there. Oak: Oak Class enjoyed a visit from Banham Zoo Roadshow on Tuesday, where they were introduced to a giant stick insect, millipede, African snail and milk snake.
