This week in class...

Preschool: We have had lots of chats around staying cool this week and the importance of having a drink and wearing a hat. Taking some time out to listen to a fairy tale meditation CD has had us all feeling quite chilled too. Numerals and hearing initial sounds have also featured in our learning along with practicing our listening skills - some of us have become very good at recognising the animal being described.
