## This week in class...

Little Brown Hare: The Kestrels have fledged and are now in the trees surrounding the school, just as we have been focusing on our pre-schoolers transitioning into school this week. Mrs Witham and Mrs Sacre have been over to play and we have had lunch in the school. The children get to see the layout of the school, use the toilet, and meet the staff team, this will help them when settling into Blackbird Class. We have also been practising some races ready for Sports day next week, with the emphasis being on having fun. All children have been assigned to a team, there is a list on the table by the gate just in case you want to know what colour their team is. We are still collecting jumble for the fete, thank you to all those that have donated already.

**Blackbirds:** Blackbirds class are starting to answer the questions, "What happens when animals live in the wrong place?" This week we have found out all about hermit crabs and where they live, how they change their shells and how they can end up living in very unsuitable homes. We also learnt how useful it can be for a hermit crab to live with a sea anemone. The year one children produced some lovely information sheets about all this. We have also been getting first-hand experience of where animals live - on Wednesday, a family of great tits chose lunch time to fledge from the nest. All the children were able to watch as the young birds took their first flights over our heads! In maths this week, we are learning all about money and the children have been playing games recognising different coins. They have done lucky dips, mystery envelopes, partner games and opened up money eggs to see what was inside. We have also been working hard, as ever on our phonics. Year ones have been able to enjoy phonics lessons in the fresh air with all the lovely weather we have been having.

**Wagtails:** This week in Wagtails we have been looking at the main rivers of the UK. The children have been able to use their brilliant map and atlas skills to not only locate the rivers, but also find their source as well as the sea they flow into. Using their knowledge from last week about topographical maps, the children were quick to spot that most rivers originate from areas of high altitude. We also looked at the water cycle and where rivers fit into it. The children have written some incredible stories as if they were water particles going around the water cycle.

**Skylarks:** Skylarks have had another fantastic week rehearsing their end of year play. Please remember costumes need to be brought into school in a named bag please as soon as you can. Our Year 6's have been off to Aylsham High School for their transition days in preparation for September. Well done to all the Year 5's for working so hard on their end of year assessments too!
