This week in class...

Little Brown Hare - The site has an abundance of acorns, leaves and conkers which the children have been using for a variety of activities this week. Working together to construct a conker run, creating a leaf collage of a pumpkin, chicken and a fox, acorn and conker rolling with paint to name just a few. We have also made a wolf scarecrow to enter a competition at Wroxham Barns during the half term break, visitors get to vote which scarecrow they like the best and the winners get a free school class pass. The children have also enjoyed challenging themselves with throwing and catching balloons and having some little red hens visit us this week

Blackbirds - In Blackbirds Class, we have been doing all things Little Red Hen related! We have been learning the story and doing some fantastic independent writing around the story. We have had a visit from a Little Red Hen and made some beautiful paintings following this visit. We had to think carefully about our colour mixing to make sure we got the colours right for our hens. In maths we have been exploring parts and wholes as we begin to explore addition.

Wagtails - This week in Wagtails we have been working hard on writing our Biographies on David Attenborough. It has been fantastic to see just how much the children have remembered about Attenborough as well as the amazing things they have independently found out! The class have been using their plans to write their first drafts and will be moving onto self-editing them before writing their final pieces. We have also been looking at the many weird and wonderful animal patterns there are and trying to replicate these in drawings. We have then created front covers for our topic books based on the front cover of *The Big Book of Animals* using these patterns.







Skylarks - This week it's been full steam ahead with writing our re-telling of Pinocchio. We have been reading and improving our stories using all sorts of wow words, similes and fantasy story phrases. Like Pinocchio's nose, in maths, the numbers just seem to be getting bigger and bigger with reading, writing and calculating numbers up to 1,000,000! Skylarks have all been designers in art this week, thinking about our theme of movement through mobile sculptures. Skylarks have been thinking about ways to help themselves and others via a story about a little injured bird in PSHE.

Forest School News - On Wednesday Year 5 went chestnut collecting. Some lit the fire and we roasted them on the fire and all had a taste. We got creative with the conkers making puppets and snakes. We braved the high spider web ropes and made charcoal face paint and played with our mud man city! Great team work Year 5!

Year 2 loved our potion making party! We coloured rice and made concoctions using bicarb, vinegar, food colouring and things we found in the wood. We watched them bubble and explode! We also enjoyed crafting with the conkers. We later sampled our chestnuts we had collected and roasted on the fire.
