This week in class...

Little Brown Hare - This week we've enjoyed muddy puddles and water play in the rain, floating objects and sinking object we've found around us. We've made gingerbread men and role played the story with puppets, thinking about the sly fox and how fast we can run like the gingerbread men. As the colder weather approached we have lit our wood burning stove, where we've toasted crumpets and bagels, enjoying the delicious smell of toast!

Blackbirds - This week, Blackbirds Class went out for on Autumn walk on Monday. It was really beautiful weather for it. We went looking for signs of autumn and found all sorts of things - different coloured leaves, mushrooms, berries, spiders' webs and seed heads. We noticed how the autumn sun was low in the sky. As we walked, the children loved spotting places they recognised - the church across the fields, the school from a distance and the road down to school. Back in school this week, we have been making a large map of our walk, making a class book of it and drawing detailed autumn pictures in autumn colours.

This week in class...

Wagtails - This week in Wagtails, we have been putting our food chain knowledge to use by creating a food chain collage. They started with their producer in the middle and then started adding consumers getting progressively bigger until they reached the apex predator in each chain. The children worked really hard on getting the correct size for each organism to make sure its prey fit in its mouth. As part of Anti Bullying Week, we looked at how we would reach out to people that needed help in our PSHE lesson. The children were really good at identifying when someone might need a friend.

Skylarks - This week...Skylarks have visited the Norfolk Children's Book Centre and listened to scary and deliciously dark traditional tales. The staff were very helpful and welcoming and the children were super excited to explore and read the wide array of books. Well done Freddie Forton for going the whole hog and arriving as Little Red's saviour as the brave hero woodcutter! Skylarks have put themselves in to Geppetto's shoes this week and their creative ideas have been flowing as they begin their puppet making.

Next week...warm up maths will be equivalent fractions on a number line. Also they can bring in any puppet materials or resources they'd need please.


