This week in class....

**Pre-School –** We have continued to play the Little Wandle sound games this week which has led to the children becoming quite interested in other sounds around them. They have been playing with the musical instruments a lot more and this week and I have been asked many times to find out what sounds various animals make on my laptop. We were all quite surprised to discover that the Tarantula has a rather nasty hiss and caterpillars make a squeaky sound. We have also been discussing how germs spread and encouraging the children to sneeze and cough into the elbows.

Acorn – Acorn have begun learning the story of The Little Red Hen this week. We have made actions for each event and character in the story. The children have drawn pictures and summarised the story. We have also been thinking about kindness this week and how we can show kindness towards our friends. On Thursday we took part in a live event to learn about disappearing bees. We had a story from the 3 Engineers about how bee habitats are changing and what we can do about it. **Oak** - Oak Class have continued to work on their understanding of addition and subtraction in maths and are gradually becoming more confident in making choices about which resources might help them to solve problems. In our French, we have been learning how to say the alphabet letters and looked at French pronunciation of sounds. Our Topic work has now moved on to a 3D focus, and we have been planning a design for our 'Moving on From Fear' inspired dioramas, thinking about the materials we might use and how we can present our ideas in 3D. Oak Class popped over to see the Community Cafe in action on Wednesday so that we could look at the amazing work that Birch Class had been up to. We were so impressed and talked about all of the hard work that we could see Birch had put in. We were really grateful for the surprise donation made by parents at the cafe which meant that we could all have a cake! Thank you very much!
