Topic focus: Creativity


Please share this knowledge organiser with your child to help them develop their knowledge and understanding of our topic. This knowledge organiser describes what is expected of the year one children. Reception children will access the curriculum at whatever level is appropriate for them.

What I know already:

- The names of colours
- How to experiment with colours when I paint.
- How to mix a range of colours from primary colours (year 1)

What I will learn:

- What are primary colours and how to use them to mix other colours (reception)
- About artists in the present and past who experimented with colour
- About what friendship means and how I can work collaboratively with my friends
- What happens to trees and other plants in autumn and why
- How to use google maps to find out about the local area and how to make my own picture maps



Key Outcomes -

- Plan and do an autumn walk
- A colour party in class to celebrate friendship
- After dark lanterns and poetry celebration with parents and carers.

Key Concept - friendship

Enquiry Question -

What are the colours of friendship?

Sub-questions:

- How can colours help us learn about each other?
- How can we discover the colours of autumn together?
- How can colours help us learn what friendship means?

Key Vocabulary

- Primary colours
- Secondary colours
- Colour names including different shades of colours eg: turquoise, crimson, scarlet, navy blue.

Literacy

Talk for Writing: 'The Little Red Hen' and friendship poems.

Phonics: Reception - phase 2

Year 1: recapping phase 4 and starting phase 5.

Writing Skills:

Reception: becoming confident mark-makers and writers and starting to use phonics to build words. Writing our own names.

Year 1: using phonic skills to develop independent writing of sentences, including correct punctuation.

Science

Properties of Materials - identifying and naming materials and exploring their properties

Seasonal changes - exploring the changes in the woods as summer changes to autumn and then winter.

Plants and animals - identifying common plants and animals in our local environment

PHSE - What is it like to be me?

Know the story of Jesus' birth and why Jesus is important to Christians.

Find out that Christians believe Jesus is God's son and that there are stories in the Bible about how special he was.

Think, talk and ask questions about the Christmas story and what it teaches Christians.
