#### This week in class...

Little Brown Hare - The children started the week in full swing with the few sunny days, the dressing up and music was requested, so the children danced and sang along with the birds who also thought spring has arrived early. We had pancakes over the fire on Tuesday and listened to the story Mr Wolfs pancakes. At LBH there is always an abundance of loose parts, mostly natural, these can be added to many activities like the small world imaginative play or the play dough and clay. This week we put a mirror on a table along with some natural objects and jewels so that the children experienced some transient art, working collaboratively and using lots of mathematical language.

**Blackbirds** - We have been travelling back in time in Blackbirds Class, all the way to 1666 and the Great Fire of London. The children have loved finding out about what happened and some of the stories involved. We have looked at pictures of different artefacts from the Museum of London and thought about how they help us learn about the Fire of London. We even saw some actual bricks from Pudding Lane that were still burnt. We found out that we can learn about the past from objects and also from what people wrote down. We especially liked learning that Samuel Pepys, a famous diary writer who witnessed the fire of London, was so worried about his special cheese and wine that he buried them in his garden to keep them safe. The children have been writing about what they have learnt, doing some creative writing to imagine what it would be like to be there and also experimenting with fiery paintings.

**Wagtails** - This week in Wagtails, we have been learning the epic poem Beowulf. We started by sorting out the chronology of the poem and then creating our own story maps. The children then used these to retell the story to each other before adding in the extra information they came up with in their retellings. The class really enjoyed acting out different sections of the story and there were some truly powerful performances, in particular a victorious Wiglaf and a terrifying Grendel's mother. It was brilliant to see the children really thinking about how each character would have felt at the different points of the story. Running alongside this, we've been spending a lot of time on our vocabulary and how we can really push ourselves in our writing. These will all come together as we write our own Viking sagas with the same structure as Beowulf over the next 2 weeks.








**Skylarks** - This week....Skylarks have been learning about the art of debating; the language and purpose. To help writing a balanced argument, they have revised modal verbs, formal language and rhetorical questions. Have a go at home 'Should children be able to keep animals as pets?' They have revised 2d and 3 d shapes in maths including how to describe their properties. We have all finished our unique painted pebbles too to show our feelings and we have learned about how to be more self aware and how to manage emotions.


