This week in class...

Little Brown Hare - This week we have been listening to the story 'Elmer', with activities to help embed the story, making props to support retelling, some large scale painting and decorating some elephant biscuits. The children have also had many opportunities to be adventurous and challenge themselves, managing their own risks as they climb and jump off the cable reels. At LBH we have the space for whole-bodied, expansive movement.







Blackbirds - In Blackbirds this week, we have been inspired by the architect Hundertwasser. He did not like straight lines and his houses are very curvy and unusual - everyone really liked them. The challenge this week was to transform a standard shoe box into a curvy, wonderful building inspired Hundertwasser. As they did this, the children were trying out all sorts of paper and card folding and shaping skills. Everyone was very proud of their buildings and also full of compliments for what their friends had made.









Skylarks - This week, in topic work, Skylarks have been busy studying the poem of The Highwayman by Alfred Noyse, finding out more about real-life highwaymen and women, and making our own 'Wanted' posters. We also had a fascinating trip to Great Yarmouth Magistrates Court and enjoyed acting out a mock-trial for theft and discussing how decisions about guilt are reached. In maths Year 6 have been making and solving algebraic equations and Year 5 have been finding fractions of an amount.

Next week in maths - year 5 will move onto looking at decimals and the similarities between decimals and fractions. Year 6 will continue work on algebra. And we're all looking forward to Science week!

Wagtails - This week in Wagtails, we have been writing our Viking sagas. After creating our plans and orally telling our stories to each other and adding and taking away parts after each retelling, the class excitedly started writing. It's been brilliant to see ambitious vocabulary and structure within their writing already. We were lucky enough to visit the Norwich castle museum on Thursday and enjoyed a fantastic trip learning all about a Viking warrior called Thurweald. It was fantastic to see the children really show off the knowledge they have already gained this term.









Forest School News - This wednesday we had a brilliant day with Y5. We loved our noodles and agreed it's one of our favourite warm foods in the woods. Some did a lot of digging, working together to make a trench. We also experimented with melting aluminum in a hot fire and pouring it into a mould.
