#### This week in class...

**Preschool -** Preschool have had another busy week. We have learnt about and celebrated the Hindu festival Holi by playing with colours and learning some Bhangra dances. The children especially enjoyed throwing paint to make a large splatter painting. We have also predicted what items we thought might sink or float and played 'Bertha the bus goes to the Zoo' to practice our initial sounds.

**Acorn -**This week Acorn class have continued to make their pop-up story scenes. They look fantastic and will be used to plan stories from in the next week or so. In PSHE the children have been thinking about playtimes. We have had discussions about the games girls and boys play. We have established that boys and girls can play together and play the same things if they want to. In maths we have been looking at partitioning two digits numbers into tens and ones. The class has played lots of place value games to reinforce the learning.

**Oak** - Oak Class enjoyed their nature themed project work on Monday and had lots of fun at the family learning afternoon. Our Topic work has led us to discover more about the Viking gods and goddesses over the week and we have been making our own information road map of the gods, choosing the ones we were most interested in to make some notes and sketch. In maths, we have started our shape topic and have been revisiting key information on 2D and 3D shapes, recalling the names of shapes and learning more about their properties. We have also been learning about mnemonics, to help us remember some of our tricky spelling words: Big Elephants Can Always Understand Small Elephants. We are continuing to learn how to say the colours in French and say which one is our favourite.







**Birch** - This week has been an industrious one in Birch. We began the week with a very Eco focus, working collaboratively in our houses, supporting and working well with the whole school to create plans and ideas for the reflection garden in school. We have continued reading and reflecting on extracts from Anne Frank's Diary and are now analysing some very poignant moments in her life. We have written our second biographies and self-assessed these against our first efforts. We wrote these focussing on our passionate people of importance and discussed why they were so passionate. In maths we have met algebra for the first time, creating and using formulas to calculate problems. We extended these to shapes, perimeter and area and calculated problems with missing measurements. Thursday saw us host our third Community Cafe which was a great success. It is such a pleasure to behold the class being so polite and courteous to guests and engaging in face to face conversation with adults, a rarity in this digitally oriented world. Thank you again to all the parents, aunts, uncles and grandparents who came along to help support the children.
