This week in class...

Preschool - Preschool participated in science week by making lots of towers using all sorts of different construction blocks. They learnt what they could achieve with collaboration, that being taller meant you would make taller towers and that supporting the base made it steadier. We also had funnels and measures in our water tray and the children were able to consider volume and capacity. To support the children to use sentences, we have also been using a feely box and the children have had to explain what they can feel without looking it. Funding forms and requests for new hours will be issued early next week and it will be very much appreciated if these could be returned as soon as possible.

Acorn - Acorn have had a great week learning about science. They loved having a scientist come into the school to show them experiments, particularly the exploding elephant toothpaste. They learnt about atoms, electrons and neutrons and how electrons travel through things to get to the ground. The children had the chance to find out about polymers and how you can combine them with an agent to make slime. As a finale, we watched the launch of a rocket which went up 100 feet from the playground. We were all very relieved the rocket was found in a neighbouring garden after a parachuted descent. Other highlights this week have been the creative stories the children have written based on their pop up books.

Oak - Oak Class have had a brilliant week doing lots of different activities for British Science Week. We started the week by exploring some key scientists: Albert Einstein, Marie Curie and Mary Anning. We have learned about some of their accomplishments and their contributions to science. As a class, we have explored some big thinking questions and discussed why imagination might be more important than knowledge with some really good ideas being shared. We have been conducting our own experiments and also enjoyed our workshops with an engineer and science boffin. We also developed our understanding of 3D shapes by constructing different forms from nets.








Birch - What a great week in Birch class. We began the week looking at letters, the formal type. We read an example of a formal letter and identified the different language used to informal letters. We then used this template to write a letter from Anne Frank to Hitler himself! The results were outstanding, full of emotive language and knowledge of the events of WW2. In maths we have looked at line graphs and interpreting data. The class were brilliant at this and could read graphs accurately. In our topic we began look at evacuation during the war. We discussed why children were evacuated, where to and what emotions they would have felt being separated from their families. We then wrote letters home, explaining our feelings of the journey and our thoughts on our new families. We will be studying Goodnight Mr Tom next week, watching extracts and reading the text, analysing the text and the thoughts and emotions of the characters. Thursday saw a fantastic Science Boffin visit, the children enjoyed expanding and contracting things to crush / explosion point and launching a rocket in the playground! Our Year 6 members of the class made their way to Gresham's for the inter-school STEAM competition. As holders of the trophy, we eagerly await news of our excellent participants!

We had great fun and I'm sure you'll agree that their bees look BEE-autiful.



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
