This week in class...

Preschool - Preschool have been playing the musical instruments they made last week and have listened carefully to how they can change sounds by playing softly or loudly. They also followed instructions to play slowly and fast. We have celebrated World Book Day too and have seen some lovely costumes. We listened to Doing the Animal Bop on a CD and pretended to be all the different animals as well as having lots of different stories during the day. On Thursday, we had a very special visitor - Delilah's mum brought in one of their orphan lambs 'Baaarbara' . The children learnt about what lambs eat, what we can make from their fleece and why they have a tag in their ear. The children have also been very excited to share pictures of their interests and hobbies from home on our 'This is us' display - if you have not already done so, please email or post any photographs you would like to share with Tracey on Tapestry.

Acorn - Following on from our museum visit, this week Acorn have been learning about the explorer Ernest Shackleton and his expedition on Endurance. The children looked carefully at the photograph of Shackleton and his team 111 miles from the South Pole. In their art books they made a sketch of the picture. In maths this week, we have been focusing on odd and even numbers. The children have used Numicon to support them deciding whether a number is odd or even. On Thursday as part of World Book Day, the children began creating their own stories. They are making pop-up scenes for their main characters showing the story setting. Some children have begun planning their story using pictures and talking the story in preparation for writing it.

Oak - Oak Class have continued with the measurement topic in maths and have been practising how to measure different objects and larger lengths. We have learned how to read the measurements on the ruler and how to adapt if the object we need to measure is longer or taller than the measuring device we have. In our Topic work, we have been working on the second draft of our Viking themed comic strip and have been improving our work based on our own edits and on feedback from other people. We have learned how writing for a comic strip is different to writing a longer story in prose and how to use speech, thought or sound bubbles to help tell our story. In P.E., we are continuing to hone our netball skills and are becoming more accurate at shooting. All of the children had a fantastic time for World Book Day and completed lots of book themed activities - fantastic costumes everyone!







Birch- This week we have been delving deeper into the thoughts and emotions of Anne Frank. We have read and analysed her diary entries and created our own glossaries of terms used to help us understand what was written.. In maths the children have been learning to enlarge shapes using scale factors and have even progressed onto 3D shapes and enlarging cuboids. In topic the children have begun writing their speeches on things or causes they are passionate about and watched passionate people speak. Having learned how to write a biography for Anne Franks, the children have assessed their own biographies and are now beginning to write biographies for famous, passionate people.

Next week will be our third community cafe, make a space in your diary for more yummy goodness. Thursday 9th, be there or be hungry!
