This week in class...

Preschool - Preschool has had an active first week back after the Easter break. We have been looking at basic shapes, measuring how tall we are and practicing our pen control by using our hands as templates to create animals and making lots of cakes in the mud kitchen. We have also welcomed a new child and her family to the setting.

Acorn - Acorn class have begun our new topic by looking at a aerial map of Northrepps and using magnifying glasses to identify places we know. Children have used computers to find where they live on Google Maps by typing in their address, printing out the map and locating their house. The children have written a Cold Task story about a snake and a seal that go on an adventure together. In the next few weeks we will be learning the story The Snail and the Whale and using it to write more detailed stories. Many thanks to parents who remembered to return the new reading books on the first day. This enables us to allocate these books to new children that week. In maths we have been covering the topic of capacity. Please help your child by looking at litres and millilitres on the back of bottles from the supermarket.

Oak - Oak Class have had a busy first few days back. In maths, we have begun learning how to tell the time using both analogue and digital clocks. We have been practising by moving the minute and hour hands on our practise clocks and answering questions. We have also been busy with revising our spellings from last term and have started thinking about our new Topic: Water, water everywhere! We have been using the Atlas to locate parts of the UK, including countries, seas and cities. We have also enjoyed our first music lesson with Mr Weitz, learning about rhythm and some different instruments. In French, we started learning some different food names through the story of Very The Caterpillar. Mais elle encore faim! Hungry a

Birch- Birch class have had a great first week back and have started their new topic term by learning about Ancient Greece. We have made our own kenning poems for extreme earth events that we are excited to be sharing with you in the near future. We have introduced our concept of bravery which we will be exploring over the term and thinking about what bravery means to us.
