This week in class...

Preschool

This week preschool has continued our work on hearing and saying initial sounds. We have been playing the Little Wandle game - What's in the box? We have also planted some daffodils that Debbie brought in for us in our newly cleared area and will be planting seeds after the Easter break. We have been talking about what plants need to grow - water, soil (food) and sunlight.

Acorn - Acorn class have had a very busy week innovating the story of Max's Jungle Adventure to make it their own. Some of the new adventures for Max the labrador have been set in the desert, at the beach or in Dinoland. In maths we continue to learn about measurement, in particular weighing objects using non-standard units such as cubes. In phonics, Reception have been applying all of the new sounds they have learnt in reading and spelling. It has been great to see how they are beginning to read tricky words such as we, he, she and me. Year 1 have had a week of applying all of the new alternative sounds they have learnt, along with the tricky words water, mouse, house, want, should and could.

Oak - Oak Class have had another busy and exciting week, with the Vikings visit being a stand out event, enjoyed by all. The children were lucky enough to handle objects and practice shield manoeuvers with some fantastic efforts being made on costumes. It was also a great opportunity to get to know some new friends from Erpingham. We have spent the final week of term completing studies in our subject areas and working on our Presentation of Learning front and back covers, where we will spotlight 2 or 3 of our best pieces of work from the Vikings topic. Everyone had an egg-cellent time at the House Easter activities and competitions with a vast array of egg rolling techniques on display! Have a Hoppy Easter!







Birch - This week has been a trip back in time in Birch class. We have looked at persuasive texts through propaganda posters from WW2 and the language they used to persuade. We have looked at speech Hitler used to persuade his nation of his way of thinking. Mrs Wright was a star and has brought in an air raid siren and some very important pieces of a Spitfire plane, including Mr Bishop's favourite, the pilot's goggles! We went onto the playground and sounded the siren, I think half of the village are still under their tables! We have learnt all about the role of women in world war 2 and how this was the beginning of changes in British society. We looked at the Blitz, air raid shelters and finally the Battle of Britain. This has culminated in us making our very own large scale model of an Anderson shelter in the classroom. 
