If you have a kite, see if you can get it flying high. Have a go at making a kite of your own. You could use plain paper to make a kite and then decorate it with your own drawings or write a message on it. You may want to write a poem about the sky or to send your hopes and thoughts high up into the air.

Can you find out about what sort of different animals can fly? Which animal groups do they belong to? Are they carnivores, herbivores or omnivores? Where in the world do they live? Choose a flying animal to find out about. Draw a picture and write about that animal. Can you design your own amazing flying creature?
