This week in class...

Preschool - Preschool have had another busy week. We have been talking about the life cycle of the butterfly and learnt new words such as moult and metamorphism. The tough-spot challenge in the garden this week has been to recognise numerals and count out the corresponding amount. Popular stories have been Hippo's Hat, Dirty Birty and Cave Baby. We would also like to thank Mrs Galasky for coming to play with us and hope she enjoyed her time at our hairdressing salon.

Acorn - This week Acorn class have been learning all about the continent of Africa. In particular, we have focused on the West African country of Ghana. Some children have written a mini-report on the country and all children have had a go at making Kente cloth. Some chose to weave paper strips then add a geometric pattern and others chose to stick coloured strips onto a background to make the Ghanaian fabric. All the designs look amazing! In maths we have finished our multiplication and division topic with an investigation into which numbers can be shared into 3 equal groups.

Oak -Oak Class have been revising key skills in addition and subtraction, recalling number facts and revisiting the column method. In Topic, we have started to explore a variety of maps, beginning with aerial maps and sketch maps. We have been using the things we have learnt in order to create our own local area maps, including the important features of a title, a key and symbols. We then gave each other feedback and have been improving our second drafts. In French, we have begun to learn the vocabulary of: Ma Famille, talking about the number of brothers and sisters we have. In our writing, we have been practising how to use a range of punctuation and think of interesting adjectives to describe our characters and settings.

Birch- Birch Class have been doing their SATS papers this week every morning, whilst the Year 5s have had some time with Mrs Allen focussing on their key skills and reading. The children were especially proud to show their newspaper reports following the story of the death of Medusa in assembly this week and the whole school was wowed by their use of language and expression in their writing. Well done Birch! It has not been an easy week with SATs and you have done so well.







Forest School

Last week we had a brilliant morning learning our knots, we practised the sheet bend knot then put it to the ultimate test to see if out knots could hold our weight, both a test of our trust and our knot skills! We later discussed the storm heavy clouds coming over and decided to leave the wood but a bit too late and we got caught in the rain! The Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families is a very informative website. Their mission is to close the gap in wellbeing and mental health by sharing the best science and practice with everyone.


They have a parent and carers section as well as a section for young people. There is a wealth of information to look through including self care ideas and a 24 hour parent helpline.It's well worth a look!
