What I know already:

-I already understand that living things reproduce and are adapted to suit their environments. I may already have some understanding of evolution.

-I know about careful observations when drawing. I already know that art can be created using a range of media.

Key Vocabulary

Evolution Evolve Adapt Create Observe **Key Concepts** - creativity, resilience and community.

Enquiry Question - Is evolution necessary? We will be exploring the traditional understanding of the term evolution. We will go on to question what it means more broadly for individuals and society as a whole- how we evolve creatively, socially and emotionally. We will consider what happens when things do/don't evolve.

What I will learn:

-I will reflect on how I evolve as an artist by making adaptations to my artwork and learning new skills.

-I will learn new stitches and techniques with textile embellishments to join materials and make a 3D fantastical creature.

- I will make close observational drawings of insects and other creatures. -I will reference artists from different historical periods of time who have created art based around animals, and consider what influenced them.

-I will learn that living things reproduce, have specific needs and adaptations, and may evolve over generations using the processes of natural selection.

Key Outcome -To research, set-up and hold a class **community** cafe and gallery to showcase our artwork including the processes leading to the final piece.
