## This week in class...

**Little Brown Hare -** This week the children have continued to master using one handled tools like scissors and hammers, building up strength in their hands which will help them to write. A few of the older children have become expert tree climbers during their time at LBH, ready to start school in September as confident and resilient learners. Some of the children had an opportunity to go 'outside the gate' this week, an opportunity to see a bit of the community around Erpingham, noticing a variety of flora and fauna, spotting some wild strawberries to pick and learn also about knowing what is edible and what is not and the need to check with an adult first.

**Blackbirds** - Blackbirds Class have all been very busy this week writing information about imaginary birds they have designed. There are all sorts of fantastic birds, with beautiful feathers - the children have enjoyed using their imaginations combined with their knowledge of birds. This week we also had a visit from Molly's dad, who came in to tell us all about amazing birds he had seen in Norfolk. The children loved seeing all the different birds and we learnt about colourful birds, birds with unusual beaks and many more. We were all inspired to have a good look whilst we are out and about over the summer.

**Wagtails -** This week in Wagtails, we have been creating tsunami safety posters. We looked carefully at the different symbols we could use to make sure everybody could understand even if they didn't speak English. The class used their knowledge of the different natural signs of a tsunami to help highlight the dangers and pre-warn people. We have also been using and drawing maps as well as working on compass points and directional language. The year 2s put their new skills to the test by drawing mazes on the playground and leading each other around blindfolded using just their voices to guide them.

**Skylarks** - It's been another busy week in Skylarks with lots of work on our play and Greek adventure quests. The year 5s had a great day at Forest School on Wednesday and got particularly wet and muddy! Year 6 had a fun time bowling at JRs for their end-of-term treat on Friday afternoon while the year 5s enjoyed working with Little Brown Hare and Wagtails. We've also been looking at time in maths and carried out an investigation into probability.
