## This week in class...

**Preschool** -Role-play, threading and hide-and-seek have been very popular in preschool this week as well as playing with shapes. We have also been happy to have Acorn class visit us and to share our favourite games with them. Our Little Wandle activity this week helped us to recognise t, b and c sounds at the beginning of words.

**Acorn -** This week Acorn class was flooded so we all had to relocate to other parts of the school while the classroom dries out. We have spent some time at Pre-School playing, singing and listening to stories. We have also been in the Nurture room doing our usual phonics and maths lessons. This week we have been using numicon to help us work out one more and one less than a number. We have also been practising our handwriting, trying to get letters sitting in the right place. In their sketchbooks the children have been learning how to draw scales on a dragon and draw dragon eyes. It was quite a challenge and the children had to look really closely and describe what they noticed before starting to draw. We hope to be back in our classroom next week sometime.

Oak - This week in Oak class we have been very busy using descriptive language to help us describe a wolf, describe a wolf trap and to describe the wolves cave. As a group of problem solvers we further needed to support Mrs Pig over her worry about a wolf lurking around the island. We decided to make wanted posters and place them around the village to help the 'good' fairy tale characters know what the wolf looked like. However, this didn't seem to get the wolf out so we decided we might need to trap the wolf to find out what was going on. The children designed their wolf trap and placed it down. We patiently waited until the wolf was caught and we soon found out through CCTV that the wolf was actually worried that she wouldn't be able to get home to her pups. This changed the problem solvers' minds and we decided to let the wolf go and investigate the wolves home. We got our mountain gear ready and trekked up mountains and through forests until we found the wolves cave. We described what the cave looked like, especially the outside of the cave as there were lots of bones. The story continues into next week thinking about how we can help both the wolves and Mrs Pia. In maths, the children have been learning how to represent two and three digit numbers and learning about place value. We have been partitioning numbers to show our understanding of a number. We also had our half term lesson about Online Safety and thought about avatars can be anyone online and we shouldn't make assumptions that we know that person as it could be anyone. We spoke about the importance of not sharing any personal information online and how we must speak to a trusted adult if we see anything we are unsure about. Lastly, the children had a fantastic time at Gymnastics this week and were a credit to the school. They really shone showing their gymnastic skills.

**Birch-** This week in Birch class we have been thinking about how we group and classify animals according to their similarities and differences. We found out about the groundbreaking life of Maria Sybilla Merian. She travelled the world making beautiful and accurate drawings of the animals she saw, and helped people to understand how those animals fit into their ecosystem. We have continued working on place value including using number lines in maths, and are working with number numbers to a one thousand/ one million. We have also planned a presentation to give to Skylarks class next week. They have been inspired by our previous community cafe's and would like help in setting up their own.


