This week in class...

Pre-school: Preschool has been very creative this week. We have seen some lovely collages and paintings with an Easter and Holi theme. The children have also been practicing hard at writing their names too and there has been some impressive pencil control. With Spring now more evident, we have been discussing animals and their babies and their life cycles.

Acorn: Acorn class has been learning about the life of Mary Anning, the palaeontologist, and how she made some great discoveries on the beach. At last the dinosaur eggs have hatched after a long wait! The children have also been finding out about dinosaur facts. We have learnt about the T-Rex, Triceratops, Stegosaurus, Diplodocus and the Ornithomimus. Please ask your child what they remember. Finally, we have learnt about the Christian festival of Easter and the story behind it.

Oak: This week in Oak class the children have been looking at creating stories using tension and suspense. They are also busy writing up their news reports on Crime and Punishment in Roman, Anglo-Saxon, Victorian and modern times.

Topics for next term

Each term we choose key concepts as the basis for our curriculum which we will explore, helping the children to deepen their understanding. Our concepts for next term are: **belonging**, **diversity**, **sustainability** and **equality**.
